CtA+ Multi-stakeholder Pledge on Gender Equality and Protection from Gender-based Violence

Key Outcome

- Displaced and stateless women and girls have improved access to inclusive and quality genderbased violence (GBV) prevention and response services¹
- Innovative partnerships with Women Refugee-led Organizations (WRLOs) advancing gender equality and protection from GBV ²

Background

Gender Equality and protection from GBV underline all GCR objectives. The 2023 GRF offers an opportunity to galvanize the collective action and accountability needed to address GBV and advance gender equality in the context of forced displacement (during humanitarian responses and across the nexus). As the lead of the <u>Call to Action on Protection from GBV in Emergencies</u> (CtA), Germany welcomes multi-stakeholder commitments under the 2023 GRF, particularly those which increase refugees' access to prevention measures, survivor-centred services and promote leadership of refugee women.

Pledge Description

The Call to Action+ (CtA+) pledge will contribute to strengthening national systems including (refugee) women-led organizations:

- Inclusion of forcibly displaced and stateless people in national protection systems, including safe and dignified access by women and girls to GBV prevention and response services. This includes the strengthening of systems and services in refugee hosting countries.
- Innovative partnerships with women refugee-led organizations (WRLOs) and women-led organizations (WLOs) advancing gender equality and protection from GBV in different displacement settings.

Pledging guidance is available to support the development of concrete pledges, as well as a multistakeholder pledge development tracking tool and visualization map for contributing entities to facilitate collaboration such as pre-matching.

Commitments and pledge contributions include supporting contexts where host governments foster the inclusion of refugees in national protection systems, as well as supporting the leadership of displaced women and refugee women-led organizations in driving policy discussions, self-reliance, and safe networking spaces.

Achievement of results depends on improved data gathering and analysis on gender, age, and disability dimensions of forced displacement as well as mainstreaming of gender and GBV risk mitigation measures.

The pledge is transformative in scale and innovative in approach (i.e. advancing localization and creative ways of partnering with WRLOs).
